

2015 HHS COMPETES Mini-Accelerator

The HHS Competes Mini-Accelerator is a two-week series of virtual workshops designed to transform a prize/challenge from idea to actionable plan. Government partners from the White House, GSA, USAID, and consultants from Luminary Labs, Capitol Consulting, and others will be participating in order to provide teams guidance in developing custom prizes that fit their needs.

The Accelerator will begin with an in-person kickoff event on Monday, July 13 and ending with a final presentation session on Tuesday, July 28, both held at HHS Headquarters. All other activities, including workshops and group check-ins, will be held virtually.
