#### \* Next Steps


Between now and the next meeting on May 15-16, the Working Group will:

  - Final report will be informed by public comments
- Receive the Inventory of Federal Actions due May 11
  - Data entry and analysis will start immediately
  - Final report will reflect inventory findings

Revision and final desktop publishing complete	November 14, 2018
Final review for typographical errors plus 508 compliance complete	November 21, 2018
Submit final report to Congress	December 18, 2018
