## **Associations**

### Varied and far-reaching

- Trade associations—established by industries to allow businesses in the same industry to connect to and benefit from one another.
- **Professional associations**—organizations established to further specific professions and the interests of those who work in them; members are individuals, rather than businesses.
- **Philanthropic organizations**—give or receive support from money allocated for humanitarian purposes.

Typically, associations qualify as

 Non-governmental organizations—organizations that are neither part of a government nor conventional for-profit businesses; may be funded by governments, foundations, or businesses. Some have charitable status, others are registered for tax exemption based on social purposes. An organization or group of individuals affiliated with one another who share a common purpose, interest or mission and exist for the mutual enrichment and advancement of their membership

## **AVMA and AVMF as exemplars**

- American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA)
  - Professional association serving the veterinary profession
  - Anticipated to reach 100,000 members (veterinarians) by end of 2022
  - Approximately 75% of veterinarians in the US are members
  - Member-focused and trusted, volunteer directed
  - Approximately 170 staff members, 25% are veterinarians, including many with advanced degrees and specialty board certifications



- Charitable arm of the AVMA
- Focus areas include veterinary education, veterinary research, charitable care for animals, disaster response



Identification, collaboration, mitigation, and mobilization


Key contacts in critical organizations/agencies/institutions, scheduled calls

- Existing and needed information and guidance
  - Proactive (e.g., biosecurity, antimicrobial stewardship, animal depopulation)
  - Reactive (e.g., current knowledge, case triage and management, conservation and alternatives to disposable PPE)
  - Emergent (e.g., alternatives to scarce or unavailable treatments and products, supply chain and personnel impacts)
- Resources
  - Response personnel—identification and training
  - Products and supplies—identification, prioritization, and redirection/repurposing
  - Service adaptations
    - Clinical
    - Laboratory
    - Disease control
    - Technology
- Financial support through the AVMF and AVMA Trust










# Information compilation and dissemination

## Central resource center with targeted delivery in multiple formats

- Comprehensive—science and impacts, practice resources, supply chains, business and economics, legislation and relief programs, wellbeing
- Resources that reflect collaborative compilation and evolving guidance
- Digital delivery—website, newsletters, flowcharts, CE sessions, posters, social media, detailed guidance documents









# **Advocacy**

#### Supporting prudent actions by federal and state governments and the private sector

- Associations develop relationships, credibility, and trust over time
- Relationships and credibility are critical during a crisis when there is a massive and urgent need for information and support from multiple places
  - Congress and state legislatures
  - Federal and state agencies
  - Variety of industries, businesses, and their associations
- Advocacy led by associations can move mountains—and did—during the most recent pandemic
  - Veterinary practices were designated as essential services at the federal and state levels; allowed us to protect animal and human health, as well as animal resources
  - Practical guidance and assistance from
    - DHS
    - ASPR
    - CDC
    - FDA
    - USDA
    - SBA
  - Appropriations for response and relief efforts
  - Advocacy for recognition of training and skills led to a cadre of boots-on-the ground vaccinators who could help traditional human healthcare providers deliver life-saving vaccines
