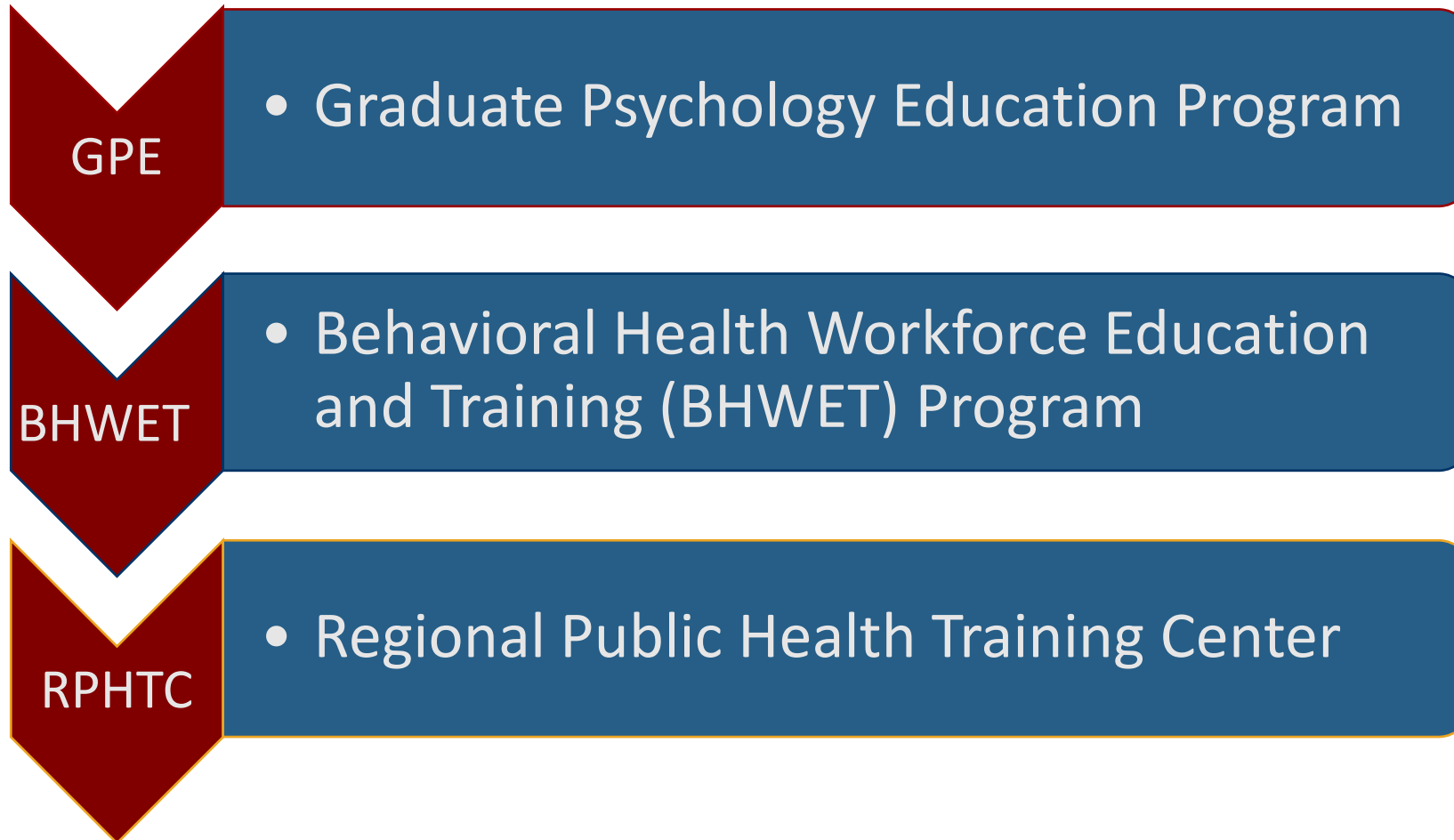

Health and Public Safety Workforce Resiliency Training Program



Health and Public Safety Workforce Resiliency Training Program (HPSWRTP)

Will reduce and address burnout, suicide, mental health conditions and substance use and promote resiliency among:

- Health care students, residents, professionals, paraprofessionals, trainees, public safety offices [collectively know as the health workforce]
- Health care employers

Summary of Funding

- Project Period January 2022 to December 31, 2024
- 34 Cooperative Agreements
- Funding: YR1 \$1,079,333; YR2 \$709,000; and YR3 \$492,333



Health and Public Safety Workforce Resiliency TA Center



Health and Public Safety Workforce Resiliency Technical Assistance Center (HPSWRTAC)

- Provides tailored training and technical assistance (TA) to the recipients of two programs:
 - Promoting Resiliency and Mental Health among Health Professional Workforce (HRSA-22-110)
 - Health and Public Safety Workforce Resiliency Training Program (HRSA-22-111)
- These programs use innovative strategies for providers, trainees and students to: promote mental and behavior health, prevent suicide and reduce occurrences of burnout and substance use.

Summary of Funding

- Project period January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2024
- 1 Cooperative Agreement
- Funding FY22 up to \$2,000,000
