Overall Meeting Objectives:

As an advisory body to the Secretary of Health and Human Services, and in accordance with its newly expanded scope and charge "to inform and influence national and community-based policies and programs which impact infant and maternal mortality and related health outcomes of women, children, and families," SACIM will:

Objective 1: Identify and utilize immediate opportunities for action to fulfill its charge in the next year.

- Review previous SACIM recommendations to determine their continued urgency and relevance, and identify gaps in recommendations,
- Develop pragmatic recommendations for immediate action for improving the health of mothers and infants,
- Identify other emerging and/or urgent policy matters that impact maternal and infant health for briefing, discussion, and potential future recommendations by Fall 2020, and
- Leverage SACIM's relationship with strategic partners and stakeholders in the development and advancement of recommendations to address key maternal and infant health issues.

Objective 2: Relative to existing opportunities, expand SACIM's shared knowledge and understanding of leading issues/factors/initiatives that can influence the health and well-being of mothers and infants and the communities in which they live.

- Be updated on Federal activities related to the health of mothers and infants and be informed about selected community-based programmatic efforts to address health disparities and inequities,
- Deepen SACIM's understanding of the perinatal workforce needed to provide the services essential to improving maternal and infant health and reducing disparities, and
- Expand and strengthen the active participation of essential partners across sectors in addressing
 infant and maternal mortality and accompanying inequities and assure the robust engagement of
 key stakeholders in shaping recommendations and supporting strategic solutions.

Objective 3: Establish a framework, strategy, and organizational foundation to effectively execute our charge to address the issues and factors that impact maternal and infant health and create the organizational foundation to effectively execute our charge to address those issues and factors.

- Develop a strategy for moving the work of SACIM to improve the health and well-being of mothers and infants and advance equity,
- Maintain the explicit commitment and collective readiness among SACIM members to anchor the committee's work around advancing equity,
- Craft all projects, activities, and/or policy recommendation made by SACIM through a focus and framework of advancing equity,
- Determine the frequency and form of SACIM meetings and the resources necessary to effectively address the objectives of the SACIM Charter, and
- Evaluate the work of SACIM by its impact on improving health outcomes and reducing health disparities among all infants and mothers.
