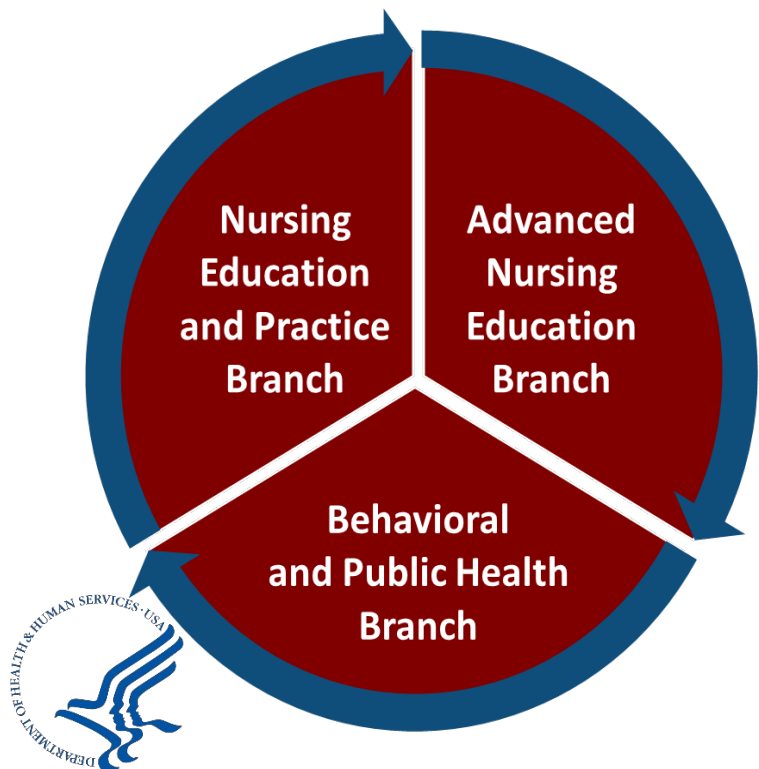
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# Division of Nursing and Public Health (DNPH)

DNPH administers and provides oversight of nursing, behavioral and public health workforce development programs

# Nursing Education and Practice (NEP) Branch FY19 Investments

## Nurse Education, Practice, Quality and Retention (NEPQR) - Veteran Nurses in Primary Care (VNPC)

Recruits and trains undergraduate nursing students who are veterans and current primary care RNs to practice in community based primary care

## Nurse Education Practice Quality and Retention (NEPQR) Interprofessional Collaborative Practice (IPCP) Behavioral Health Integration (BHI)

Integrates evidence based, interprofessional team-based models of behavioral health services into nurse-led primary care

## Nurse Education Practice Quality and Retention (NEPQR) Registered Nurses in Primary Care (RNPC)

Prepares nursing students and current registered nurses to practice at the full scope of their license in community-based primary care teams.

## Nursing Workforce Diversity (NWD)

Provides nursing education opportunities for students from disadvantaged backgrounds including underrepresented racial and ethnic minorities among registered nurses

# Advanced Nursing Education (ANE) Branch FY19 Investments

## ANE- Nurse Practitioner Residency Program (ANE-NPR)

Prepares new nurse practitioners (NPs) in primary care for practice in community-based settings through clinical and academic focused 12-month Nurse Practitioner Residency (NPR) programs

## Advanced Nursing Education Workforce (ANEW)

Supports academic-practice partnerships to prepare primary care advanced practice registered nursing students to practice in rural and underserved populations.

## ANE-Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (ANE-SANE)

Increases the number of Registered Nurses (RNs), Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) and Forensic Nurses trained and certified as sexual assault nurse examiners (SANEs) in communities in need.

## Nurse Anesthetist Traineeship (NAT)

Provides quality training to prepare students to serve as an integral part of the anesthesia and pain management team.

## Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP)

Increases the number of qualified nursing faculty by supporting schools of nursing to establish and operate a student loan fund.



# Behavioral and Public Health (BPH) Branch FY19 Investments

## BPH

### Regional Public Health Training Centers (PHTCs)

Strengthens the technical, scientific, managerial, and leadership competencies of the public health workforce.

### Behavioral Health Workforce Education and Training (BHWET)

Expands the behavioral health workforce (professionals and paraprofessionals) serving in rural and underserved areas.

### Graduate Psychology Education (GPE)

Prepares doctoral-level psychologists to provide integrated behavioral health to rural and underserved populations.

### BHWET Supplemental Funding

Supports current BHWET grantees to improve access to opioid use disorder (OUD) and other substance use disorder (SUD) treatment using integrated, interprofessional care teams.

### Opioid Workforce Expansion Workforce Program (OWEP)

Enhances community-based training for students preparing to become behavioral health professionals and paraprofessionals focused on opioid use disorder and other substance use disorders.
