The Time is Right for TENDR

- Scientific Consensus: Toxic chemicals play a role in neurodevelopmental disorders.
- Widespread exposures to pregnant women and children.
- Intellectual, developmental, learning disabilities affect 1 in 6 children in U.S.; Children of color more at risk.
- Increasing prevalence of autism spectrum disorder, ADHD.

- "TENDR's science-based advocacy tipped the balance" in
 - NY & CA state bans on neurotoxic pesticide chlorpyrifos.
 - Dow Chemical decision to halt production of chlorpyrifos by end of 2020.
 - Federal agency rulings on PBDE flame retardants & lead.
- TENDR Policy Resolution gains champions in U.S.
 Senate & Biden Administration.
- American Medical Association adopts TENDR recommendations to eliminate child lead poisoning as AMA policy.
