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




What is PRAMS?



- Population-based surveillance system
- Self-reported maternal behaviors and experiences around the time of pregnancy
- Supplements birth certificate information
- State/site and near-national estimates

Phase 9 Survey Revision













Goals of the Phase 9 Revision



- Update survey content (Phase 8 developed in 2014)
 - Ensure relevance of topics & questions to current environment
 - Address emerging priorities in MCH
- Capture priority topics across CDC, other federal and non-federal partners, grantees and their stakeholders
- Align with national performance measures (e.g., Healthy People 2030, Title V program)
