

Primary Care: Key Strategies








Accomplishments:

- Modernized nearly 2,300 service delivery sites
- 96% of health centers have installed Electronic Health Records (EHR)
- 59% of health centers are Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) recognized




Program Goals:

- Increase % of health centers that report UDS data using an EHR.
- Increase % of health centers reaching Stage 2 Meaningful Use Standards
- Increase % of health centers with PCMH at all sites
- Increase % of health centers with modernized facilities






Health Center Prenatal Patients (3 Year Trend)







Health Center Staffing (FTE)




Low Birth Weight








Access to Prenatal Care (First Prenatal Visit in 1st Trimester)








Tobacco Use Screening




Tobacco Cessation Counseling







Adult Weight Screening and Follow Up



Measure Definition

Tobacco Assessment: Patients queried about tobacco use one or more times in the measurement year or prior year.

Tobacco Cessation Counseling: Tobacco users aged 18 or older who have received cessation advice or medication

Adult Weight Screening and F/up: Patients aged 18 and older with (1)_BMI charted *and* (2) follow-up plan documented *if* patients are overweight or underweight
