




HHS Organization Chart







Federal Advisory Committees





Federal Advisory Committee Act

The Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA):

- Governs the establishment, operation, and termination of federal advisory committees
 - Approximately 1,000 advisory committees
 - FACA Database (https://facadatabase.gov/)
- Sets requirements for openness and transparency
 - Federal Register Notice (FRN)
 - Provides opportunities for public comment





FACA

General FACA Requirements

- Develop and file a committee charter
- Hold open public meetings
 - Announce meetings in the Federal Register (15 days in advance of the meeting)
- Allow the public to submit written or provide oral statements
- Publish minutes or summaries of meetings
- Maintain committee documents for public inspection



National Advisory Council on Nurse Education and Practice

As a federal advisory committee, the National Advisory Council on Nurse Education and Practice (NACNEP) provides advice and recommendations to:

- 1. HHS Secretary
- 2. Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (U.S. Senate)
- 3. Committee on Energy and Commerce (U.S. House of Representatives)





NACNEP

NACNEP provides advice and recommendations on Title VIII of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act, as amended, in support of nursing education and practice, which includes:

- Enhancement of the composition of the nursing workforce
- Improvement of the distribution and utilization of nurses to meet the health needs of the nation
- Expansion of the knowledge, skills, and capabilities of nurses to enhance the quality of nursing practice
- Development and dissemination of improved models of organization
- Financing and delivery of nursing services
- Promotion of interdisciplinary approaches to the delivery of health services, particularly in the context of public health and primary care







Structure

NACNEP membership:

- The HHS Secretary or delegate who shall be an ex officio member and serve as the Chair
- Not less than 21 and no more than 23 members appointed by the Secretary
- Full council consists of representatives from:
 - Nurse educators
 - Practicing nurses
 - Advanced practice nurses
 - Nursing students
 - Hospitals and other institutions that provide nursing services
 - The general public



Structure

NACNEP membership (continued):

- Broad geographic representation
- Balance of rural and urban members
- Balance of gender and demographic representation
- Council members are Special Government Employees



Structure

Council meetings are:

- Called by the DFO (or designee), who shall approve the agenda and be present at all meetings
- Held at least two times annually
- Conducted face-to-face or through webinar/teleconference
- Open to the public

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Federal staff
 - Designated Federal Official (DFO)
 - Advisory Committee Operations (ACO)
- Council Leadership
 - Chair
- Members
 - Non-Federal
 - Federal



Roles and Responsibilities

Designated Federal Official (DFO)

- Ensures compliance with FACA, and any other applicable laws and regulations
- Calls, attends, and adjourns committee meetings
- Approves agendas
- Maintains required records on costs and membership
- Ensures efficient operations
- Maintains records for availability to the public (FACA Database, council website)
- May adjourn meeting when in public interest
- Works closely with the Advisory Council Operations Team



Roles and Responsibilities

Chair

- Participates in the development of meeting agendas
- Resides at all committee meetings and ensures that the agenda is closely adhered to
- Ensures all rules of order and conduct are maintained during each session
- Calls for a vote, if/when required
- Controls public participation during the open portion of a meeting
- Certifies to the accuracy of the minutes of each committee meeting prior to their distribution



Roles and Responsibilities

Members

- Attend scheduled meetings of the full committee
- Review required material before meetings
- Read and understand provisions related to conflict of interest, ethics, and confidentiality and, as appropriate, completes necessary forms relating to these areas
- Complete necessary paperwork to ensure ethics requirements and compensation for his/her duties (e.g. submit original travel receipts)
- Participate in development of committee recommendations and reports



Advisory Council Operations

The Advisory Council Operations (ACO) team:

- Creates efficient, consistent and streamlined processes across
 Bureau of Health Workforce Advisory Councils
- Coordinates and manages all public meeting logistics
- Tracks council members terms
- Collects and manages member nomination process
- Maintains council charters
- Serves as liaison for human resources, contracting and communications
- Coordinates Annual Councils Report process for BHW Councils
- Coordinates travel of council members



National Center for Health Workforce Analysis

- Conducts health professions workforce data collection, analysis, and evaluation
- Publishes Health Workforce Projections
- Examines issues that impact the supply, demand, distribution, and education of the nation's workforce
- Provides policymakers with information necessary to make decisions regarding health professions workforce and delivery of care







Government **Accountability** Office (GAO)

- An independent, nonpartisan agency that works for Congress
- Audits agency operations to determine whether federal funds are being spent efficiently and effectively

- Performs policy analyses and outlines options for congressional consideration



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
