- No effects of COVID-19 in the projections

Workforce Projections


The National Center for Health Workforce Analysis helps public and private organizations understand how Changes in population will affect future workforce demands. By estimating supply, demand, and distribution of health care workers, we inform policy to help prevent shortages and surpluses.





Workforce Projections Dashboard by the Numbers


- Over 14,000 data points

➤ What is AHRF?

- Comprehensive data on a number of health topics
- Established in 1975 and contains historical data

Area Health Resource Files

The Area Health Resource Files (AHRF) include data on Health Care Professions, Health Facilities, Population Characteristics, Economics, Health Professions Training, Hospital Utilization, Hospital Expenditures, and Environment at the county, state and national levels, from over 50 data sources





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AHRF Background

What is in AHRF?

- Health care professions (state and county-level data)
- Health professions training (schools, enrollment, graduates)
- Hospital and health care facilities (admissions, visits, beds, expenditures)
- Population data (demographics, socioeconomic status)
- Vital statistics (mortality, natality)

National Sample Survey of Registered Nurses (NSSRN)

- NSSRN covers many aspects of the RN work experience
- Publishing data since 1977
- Preparing the survey for the 2022 NSSRN with Census Bureau





Collecting data

- Target population currently actively licensed RNs
 - Complete list in the U.S. does not yet exist
- Frame construction from state licensure board listings
 - National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN)
 - Individual state licensure boards
- Stratified systematic random sample of ≈ 100,000






2018 NSSRN findings: Workforce

- Estimated 3,957,661 actively licensed registered nurses living in the
 United States, as of December 31, 2017
 - Of those, 83% were actively licensed and employed in nursing
- Approximately 40% of the current RN workforce graduated from their initial nursing program in 2005 or later
- An average of 18.9 years of experience post initial RN licensure




Distribution of Race and Ethnicity by Graduation Year








Distribution of Full-Time/Part-Time Employment by Age Group
