Legislative Authority

Training in General, Pediatric, and Public Health Dentistry and Dental Hygiene Programs

- Authority:
 - 42 U.S.C. § 293k–2 (section 748 of the Public Health Service Act).

• Purpose:

 To support and develop education and training programs in general, pediatric, and public health dentistry to include programs for student financial assistance, traineeships, faculty development, and pre- and post-doctoral training, as well as the establishment or operation of a faculty loan repayment program.







Program Intended Outcomes



SUPPLY

Increases the number of academic professionals needed in oral health care field



ACCESS

Increases the number of academic faculty retained in the oral health field will allow programs to expand their training for future oral health workforce and address the necessary skills required to provide care in rural and underserved areas

> Provide significant and much needed student debt relief

Stronger Public Health Work Force



DISTRIBUTION

Incentivizes individuals that otherwise would have gone into, or remained, in private practice to work in academia to foster training for future oral health workforce





Eligibility

Eligible accredited entities are:

- Programs of general, pediatric or public health dentistry in public or private nonprofit dental or dental hygiene schools
- Approved residency in general, pediatric, or public health dentistry
- Advanced education programs in the practice of general, pediatric, or public health dentistry





Maximum Funding Amounts


- 8 grants with \$100,000 each in Year 1
- 5-year period of performance
- Funding varies by grant year
- HRSA may not consider an application if it exceeds the ceiling amount for the federal portion of funding.

Which Faculty Can Receive Loan Repayment?

Qualifications for LRP faculty eligibility:

Must be a citizen, national, or permanent resident of the United States


Must be employed in the United States or its territories

Be a full-time faculty member in general dentistry, pediatric dentistry, dental public health or dental hygiene






Example: How Loan Repayment Works

*Priority 8: Special/Vulnerable Populations oral health care education center or training program



 Preference is given to pediatric dentistry faculty who will be supervising dental students and residents at dental training institutions that provide clinical services at dental clinics located in dental schools, hospitals, or community-based affiliated sites.

| General Dentistry: | 52 | 81% |
| Dental Hygiene: | 18 | 72% |
| Public Health Dentistry: | 3 | 66% |

Statistics



- Academic Year 2020-2021 (66 dental faculty):
 - 38% underrepresented minorities
 - 23% from a disadvantaged background
 - 12% from a rural background
 - 57% newly recruited or retained
