NACNEP Council Members (Day #2)

Welcome Remarks

Dr. Janet Heinrich, Associate Administrator for the Bureau of Health Professions welcomed the NACNEP Council members and provided an update on the status on current issues affecting the Bureau of Health Professions (BHPr), the bureau's activities and in particular, those within the Division of Nursing. Dr. Heinrich also introduced Dr. Cathy Rick who is currently detailed to the bureau to help lead the effort on the veteran's initiative, as well as efforts concerning interprofessional practice. Dr. Heinrich also provided an update on the change in leadership within the Division of Nursing.

Nursing Workforce Diversity and Health Equity Agenda Presentation

Dr. Shanita Williams provided a presentation on nursing workforce and health equity.

Following Dr. William's presentation, Dr. Bakos commended Dr. Williams's efforts in her branch to critically assess the current stance of nursing workforce diversity and determine why we haven't been able to 'move the needle'. One of the changes made is reflected in the current funding opportunity announcement (FOA) for the Nursing Workforce Diversity (NWD) program which now includes a requirement to identify and address the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) that are typically barriers to certain areas or communities trying to achieve health equity. Dr. Bakos encouraged the council to review the FOA and provide feedback or comments.

NACNEP council members offered several constructive comments post Dr. William's presentation.

NACNEP 11th Draft Report Presentation

Dr. Carol Brewer led the discussion, along with a powerpoint presentation on the status and follow-up of NACNEP's 11th draft report titled "Promoting Diversity in Nursing". She also sought clarification on several points so as to move forward with an updated draft of the report. After this meeting the NACNEP 11th Report Writing Team will collaborate and follow up with an updated version with the goal in mind to finalize this report later this year.

NACNEP council members offered several constructive comments post Dr. Brewer's presentation.

Nursing Center for Health Workforce Analysis Presentation

Dr. Jennifer Nooney provided a presentation on the summary of findings from recent studies conducted on nursing data and workforce research. The plan is to publish these reports and the review/clearance process for that is underway.

Prior to Dr. Nooney's presentation, Dr. Ed Salsberg, the Director of the Nursing Center for Health Workforce Analysis, provided some background regarding the center. He stated that the national center was established about two and a half years ago. The goal of the center is to be the focal point of increased data collection and analysis, and information to inform the public and private sector regarding the mission of the Health Resources and Services Administration or HRSA.

NACNEP council members offered several constructive comments post Dr. Nooney's presentation.

Office of Performance Management Presentation

Dr. George Zangaro provided a presentation on the activities that he leads as the Director of the Office of Performance Management. Dr. Zangaro stated that the main function or focal point of his office is performance measurement and evaluation. With the performance data collected, the goal is to enhance the programs within the bureau and the planning thereof. Dr. Zangaro informed the council that there has been a migration from aggregate data collection to that of individual data collection. Dr. Zangaro stated that the performance measures, although revised for FY 2011, underwent another revision so as to improve the level of analysis that can be achieved with the data that is collected. Of particular interest was the discussion regarding the plan underway to change the reporting requirements from annual to semi-annual.

NACNEP council members offered several constructive comments post Dr. Zangaro's presentation.

NACNEP Strategic Priorities Survey Results

CDR Hunter-Thomas provided background discussion regarding the strategic priorities for NACNEP and the activities that took place preceding the meeting, namely the survey, and the results auto-generated from that survey.

NACNEP council members offered the constructive comments post CDR Hunter-Thomas' presentation, including a request to delay/defer voting on the strategic priority areas so that more information can be presented to the council.

After each of the presentations, NACNEP Council members offered several constructive comments that contributed to the deliberations ahead for the ranking of the strategic priorities.

Public Comment

Marie Barry from the American Nurses Association (ANA) shared two comments. The first comment was that the Public Health Nursing Scope and Standards is in publication and is expected to be published June 1, 2013. The second comment was that as of September 31, 2013, public health will not be a seated test for certification due to the actual numbers of nurses applying does not support this exam. It will continue to be a certification offered through the applicant submitting their portfolio and it starts January 1st of 2014. Public health nursing will still be a certification through the ANA.

Suzanne Miyamoto from the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) offered the following comments:

AACN is also working with our colleagues at ACNM (American College of Nurse-Midwives) to address the reimbursement issues around clinical training of residents with legislation pending.

Thank you also for your comments on GNE (Graduate Nurse Education) Demonstration. This is a critically important stream of funding that will end in a few years and could impact how we look at support for advanced practice registered nurse education in the future. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services will be evaluating this program and it will be crucial that the right information is weighed for the final outcome.

Adjournment

The majority of council members agreed to conduct a follow-up conference call to recalibrate the strategic priorities followed by a vote for the top four.

CDR Hunter-Thomas adjourned the meeting of Day #2 (April 25, 2013) at 3:00 pm EST
