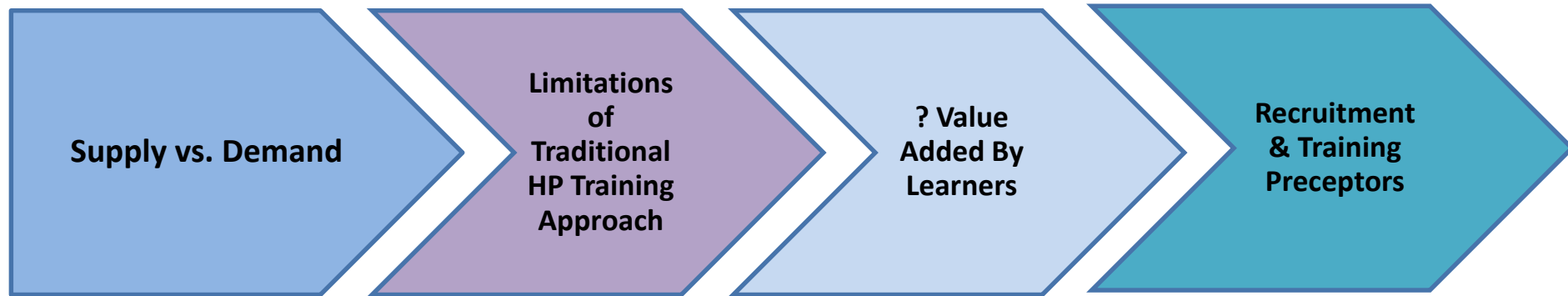
Impact


