# Brief history of the project and timeline

- In May, 2010 Dr. Sara Copeland addressed SACHDNC about population-based carrier screening and upon request from the Committee convened an expert panel (i.e., the work group) to examine these issues more fully
- SACHDNC agreed that HRSA should gather, analyze and present additional data on the issue, with Dr.
   Copeland as the project leader
- In August, 2010 HRSA partnered with ACMG staff to administer the data collection, analysis and report preparation under the guidance of Dr. Copeland



- January, 2011: in-person meeting of the work group
- April, 2011: Delphi 1<sup>st</sup> round
- May/June, 2011: Delphi 2<sup>nd</sup> round
- May 18, 2012: reported on Updates and highlights
  - Reviewed the timeline and the progress
- September 14, 2012: Interim report given
  - The 30,000 foot view of results

#### **Recommendations**

(30,000 foot view)

- (1) It is desirable to consider many **social issues**, with variation in how feasible they may be to examine further
- (2) It is desirable to consider many *economic issues*, with variation in how feasible they may be
- (3) There are *psychological issues* to consider prior to administering population-based carrier screening
- (4) There are education and communication issues to consider prior to administering this screening
- (5) It is desirable and important to consider many testing issues, with variation in feasibility



- Points to consider when conducting populationbased carrier screening programs
  - Both general to the screening process and condition specific
  - Not a list of which conditions to screen for and when to screen
